Today Neuschwanstein is one of the most popular of all the palaces and castles in Europe.

Every year 1.4 million people visit "the castle of the fairy-tale king". In the summer around 6,000 visitors a day stream through rooms that were intended for a single inhabitant. The setting of Neuschwanstein could not be

more idyllic. However, movement in the foundation area has to be continuously monitored, and the sheer rock walls must be repeatedly secured. The harsh climate also has a detrimental effect on the limestone façades, which will have to be renovated section by section over the next few years.

#### Things to see in Salzburg's old town

Salzburg's historic city center is like a precious jewel – something you simply have to admire. Located between the Salzach River and the surrounding mountains, this picturesque city has fascinated guests and locals for centuries. Because of its charm, the city of Salzburg has been designated as a World Cultural Heritage site, and its citizens take care to protect the magnificent summer and winter vistas. Narrow streets such as the Getreidegasse, the Judengasse or the Linzer Gasse invite visitors for a stroll or to shop. Within these centuries guests will find a number of exhibits to visit. Stop into one of the many typically Austrian cafés and regain your strength over an exquisite cup of coffee and a piece of pastry or strudel. There are so many things to see in Salzburg's old town. Visitors are always impressed by the magnificent Salzburg cathedral with its imposing facade, which serves as the backdrop to performances of the play Jedermann each summer during the Salzburg Festival. Equally worth a visit are the New Residence, the Mirabell Palace and Gardens, and Mozart's birthplace where guests can see some of the vestiges of Mozart, the musical genius. There are many other things to see in Salzburg's historic city center. In the Hohensalzburg Fortress – the largest intact fortress in Europe – visitors can get a look into the history of this city on the Salzach river and also enjoy a magnificent view of the town. Equally enjoyable is the impressive view of the historic old city from adjacent Mönchberg and Kapuzinerberg mountains! Come and let the beauty captivate you – visit Salzburg!

Munich city centre is a great place to stroll around in the summer. There is plenty of cafe's, restaurants and bars. Beer is a big thing in Munich and it is available everywhere. There are a plethora of amazing churches to be viewed. If you are a fan of the Swan King Ludwig you will find his tomb in one of these such churches. Neuhauser Straube runs from Munich Karlsplatz to Marienplatz. It is the main pedestrian mall and filled with shops of all design. The world famous glockenspiel at Munich Rathaus re-enacts two stories from the 16th century to the mass of tourists waiting patiently for the show. It consists of 43 bells and 32 life-sized figures. Every day at 11 a.m. (as well as 12 p.m. and 5 p.m. in summer) it can be viewed. Munich has three original town gates left Karlstor, Sendlinger Tor and Isartor. All three town gates can be viewed within the city centre region of Munich. These town gates were built during the 13th century as part of a defensive wall to protect the city.
